Adoption of Minutes from 2021 Meeting

The minutes of the 2021 Annual meeting were approved unanimously.

Reports of Officers

Chairman (Britta O'Leary)

Britta introduced herself and welcomed everyone. She thanked the Southside Seals and Rob for a fun meet, and the officials for volunteering.

Registrar (Mark Rogers)

Mark provided some statistics for the year to date.

Georgia	2022	842 swimmers (457 men, 385 women)
	2021	834 swimmers (450 men, 384 women)
National	2022	53,298 swimmers (27,696 men, 25,602 women)
	2021	51,124 swimmers (26,127 men, 24,997 women)

Mark noted that we are almost back to pre-pandemic numbers. The Year+ USMS registration offer (\$99) started on 1 July covering the rest of 2022 and all of 2023. The individual USMS registration for 2023 opens on 1 November. Those who register by 31 December 2022 get a \$5 discount (\$65, increasing to \$70 on 1 January 2023). Single event USMS registration will be \$15 for 2023.

Vice Chair (Lisa Watson)

As a member of the USMS Fitness Education Committee, Lisa talked about the virtual fitness challenges: 30-minutes Swim in February, 2K swim in June, & 1 mile swim in October. Coaches can work these into their practices. The LMSCs compete nationally and the winning LMSC may earn a stroke clinic.

Open Water (Rob Copeland)

Angel swimmers are needed for Swim Across America.

Treasurer (Ed Saltzman) – Ed reported that our LMSC is doing well financially, but more participation in meets is needed. The LCM meet at GA Tech lost money so the LMSC made up the difference to protect this meet moving forward. Scheduling meets a year in advance helps swimmers to plan well ahead, increasing participation.

New Business

Officer and At-Large Positions

After 25 years of excellence as our Newsletter Editor, Bob Kohmescher would like to step down. Ed Saltzman is hoping to offload one of his many contributions to the LMSC, specifically Webmaster.

Britta is looking for interested volunteers to fill either of these positions, as well as a new one, Social Events Chair.

Britta announced that she is appointing Ken Koontz as a new Member-at-Large. Ken also volunteered to fill the Newsletter Editor position and will talk with Bob.

2023 Georgia Masters Meet Lineup

The Maria Thrash Memorial Meet at Dynamo on 25-26 March is also the SE Zone Championships this year. Hopefully, we can add some more meets to the calendar.

2023 Georgia Grand Prix – New Ideas

This is a great event to get people to participate in our meets. Britta invited us to brainstorm some new ideas to improve it. Her suggestions included: new prizes such as mesh bags, hats, shirts, towels; having a running results list on the website to make the competition more transparent and dynamic; having a Team category where the winning team earns a discount on something; and discussing which events to include.

What Is Masters Swimming?

Britta asked the group “What do you do every day to make masters Swimming better, and to grow membership in Georgia Masters?” The Adult Swim League (Grown-Up Swimming) is extremely popular. Over 1000 swimmers participated this summer. When approached about swimming at Masters Meets and joining Masters teams, many Adult Swim League participants said that Masters was too serious, too competitive, or required too much commitment. Britta encouraged us to have ready a short “elevator speech” about Masters Swimming to alleviate these misperceptions holding people back. Jake Rynne said he liked the individualized coaching and the comradery and support of his fellow teammates. Another person cited the benefits of goal setting and how that focuses competition against the clock. Luring swimmers with more fun events was also suggested, like a relay meet or an intersquad meet for example. A commitment to fitness motivates many Masters swimmers. Britta encouraged everyone to continue to think of ideas and to attend our next Zoom meeting on 2 October.
